Lazarus at Our Gate


This famous parable, calling Christians to acknowledge the poor and marginalised, is the theme chosen for Social Justice Sunday 2013 by our Australian Catholic bishops.

They remind us of our call to proclaim the Good News and attack the root causes of injustice and inequality in our world. We can judge the moral health of a society by the way it treats its most vulnerable.

Although much progress has been made in recent decades in eliminating poverty throughout the world, much is still to be done. Over a billion souls still

live on less than \$2 a day; more than a quarter of a million women still die of childbirth each year; as many as eight million children die every year from malnutrition and preventable diseases such as diarrhoea, measles and malaria. Millions do not have access to clean drinking water and many more millions are hungry.

Australia remains a prosperous nation, despite many marginalised and



disadvantaged in our midst - the homeless, indigenous communities, refugees and asylum seekers, the disabled. Our economy rises and falls, has booms and busts, but essentially its remains strong; we survived the global financial crisis of 2007-08 almost untouched and continues to ride the resources boom from an expanding China.

Yet 20% of the world poor live in countries nearby - in Asia and the Pacific. In our own region, Australia is the rich man and Lazarus is at our gate, arriving in leaky boats, traumatised and bedraggled looking for shelter from oppression. This is the moment to hear the call of Jesus.

As for you, Timothy, man of God; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, which he will bring about at the right time - He who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honour and eternal dominion. Amen.

Gospel: Luke 16: 19-31

Jesus told this parable to those among the Pharisees who loved money: "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. "The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames." "But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us." "The man who had been rich said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house— for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment." "Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them." He said, 'No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.""
