Additionally, we proposed to relocate the café from the street front to inside the grounds of St Canice Kitchen. Creating a safe and community-based environment for our guests and volunteers alike.

Proposed Timeline (all dates are tentative)

- July/August '24 - DA Submission to Council
- Aug - December '24 - City of Sydney Council Assessment
- Jan /Feb '25 - Commence Build
- July/Aug '25- Complete Build
- Aug/Sept '25 - Launch new Kitchen
