FIRST READING

Jeremiah 31:7-9 (NRSV)

A reading from the book of the prophet Jeremiah

I am going to bring my people home- both those you are blind and those who are lame.

Thus says the Lord: "Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob, and raise shouts for the chief of the nations; proclaim, give praise, and say, 'Save, O Lord, your people, the remnant of Israel.'

"See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north, and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth, among them those who are blind and those who are lame, those with child and those in labour; together; a great company, they shall return here.

"With weeping they shall come, and with consolations I will lead them back, I will let them walk by brooks of water; in a straight path in which they shall not stumble; for I have become a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn."

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

Let us approach the throne of grace with boldness.

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honour; but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever; according to the order of Melchizedek."

Mark 10:35-45 (NRSV)

A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark

As Jesus and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"

Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" Jesus stood still and said, "Call him here." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take heart; get up, he is calling you." So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus.

Then Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man said to him, "My teacher; let me see again. Jesus said to him, "Go; your faith has made you well." Immediately the man regained his sight and followed Jesus on the way.

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL








The month of November is traditionally the month we pray for the dead in the hope they rest in enternal peace.
