1 Kings 17:10-16 (NRSV)

A reading from the first book of Kings

The widow made a little cake and brought it to Elijah.

Elijah, the prophet, set out and went to Zarephath. When he came to the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks; he called to her and said, "Bring me a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink." As she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, "Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand."

But she said, "As the Lord your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of meal in ajar; and a little oil in a jug; I am now gathering a couple of sticks, so that I may go home and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die."

Elijah said to her; "Do not be afraid; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterwards make something for yourself and your son. For thus says the Lord the God of Israel: 'The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the Lord sends rain on the earth.'"

She went and did as Elijah said, so that she as well as he and her household ate for many days. The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the Lord that he spoke by Elijah.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

Christ appeared once for all to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself.

Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf.

Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world.

But as it is, Christ has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that comes the judgment, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Mark 12:38-44 (NRSV)

A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark

They devour widows' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation."

Jesus sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny.

I have been asked by Sydney Catholic Schools, and ACU jointly, to accompany 25 young adults who have been awarded the George Pell Travelling Scholarship to Rome and London. They are mainly young school leavers from Western and Southern Sydney.

On the way home to Australia I will be going via Northern Thailand, with another group of uni students, to visit social enterprises as a part of Colombière Social Enterprises - the new young adult driven charity hosted by the parish. The work there which we are supporting includes a Co-op Lettuce Farm for Karen and Hmong tribal families in the mountains. The young people with me will also lead a workshop on social enterprise for the university students of Xavier Learning Centre in Chiang Rai looking for local opportunities there.

I am sorry for the extent of my absence on this work trip, but I have full confidence in our wonderful parish staff under Fr Dave Ryan's care. I look forward to preparing to celebrate the birth of Our Saviour with you on my return.
